- Feb 10: Course selection portal opens on Powerschool and the course selection book goes online.

# Graduation Requirements 18 credits to graduate with these mandatory credits.

- 3 Math
- 2 Science
- 1 Canadian Studies
- 1 Global Studies

- 1 Physical Education
- 1 Fine Arts
- •1 "other" credits from Technology, Math, or Science

\*Must have 5 Gr. 12 level courses to graduate\*

### **Course Types at Millwood:**

ACADEMIC- can be taken for University or NSCC prep.

ADVANCED (ADV) - usually for students who excel in the subject or are going to University. Offered in grade 11 and 12 only.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)- usually for students who excel in the subject or are going to University. Offered in grade 12 only.

GRADUATION or OPEN- Can be counted towards mandatory graduation requirements or as an elective.

All course types are indicated with course descriptions in the course selection book

#### **CHOOSING COURSES:**

- Students going into Grade 10 students will choose 8 Courses and 2 alternates
- Students going into Grade 11 students will choose 7 Courses and 2 alternates
- Students going into Grade 12 students will choose 6 Courses and 2 alternates
- Pick courses for both semesters
- •Course changes in September are only done to correct errors or balance course load if possible- so choose wisely! Your alternatives are incase you don't get your first choice of elective. The computer fills them in in no particular order.


•Resource and Learning Centre students should talk with their resource teacher about their course selection

#### **Grade 9 Course Selection**

- •School Counsellors will be visiting grade 9 classes to assist all grade 9s with entering their course requests in PowerSchool.
- •Please ensure you have a computer login and PowerSchool login.


This will take place on Feb 13th,14th, 18th

- **Step 1:** Go onto your chromebook and go to Millwood High School Website: Our School: Under For Students click Powerschool For Students.
- **Step 2:** Log into Powerschool and click on class registration on the left. You should get a screen that looks like this! (but with 2025-2026 dates)



- **Step 3:** click on the edit icon (pencil on the right) and choose your courses. Click OK after each one. The red exclamation will turn into a green check mark when you are done each section.
- **Step 4:** When finished all sections- hit submit at the bottom. If there are problems, there will be an error message.

NOTE: You can go in and change your selections up until Feb 28th. If you want to make changes after that you will have to see your School Counsellor.

#### French Immersion...

If a student wishes to come out of French Immersion at the end of grade 9-please have their parent/guardian confirm this with their school counsellor or they will not be permitted to choose English courses for grade 10.

#### **Mathematics- Grade 10**

Required to take one of the following:

- Math 10 Inquiry (Graduation)
- Math 10 (Academic- 2 credits)

#### **Mathematics- Grade 10**

The Nova Scotia mathematics curriculum provides students the knowledge, skills, and understandings for post-secondary programs or direct entry into the workforce.

High school mathematics courses are organized into four pathways: Academic, Pre-calculus (GRADE 11 and 12), Mathematics at Work and Mathematics Essentials with each pathway being organized to provide specific mathematical contexts, concepts and skills.

When choosing a pathway, students should choose a pathway that best fits their interests and plans after high school.


For students entering Grade 10, Mathematics 10 provides the most flexibility for future courses. This would be a good choice for students unsure of their post-secondary plans. Students, parents, and educators are encouraged to research the admission requirements for post-secondary programs of study as they vary by institution and by year.

## **Inquiry Math I10**

Inquiry Mathematics 10 Pilot: During the current school year, Island View High / Millwood High / Dartmouth High is participating in a pilot course, Inquiry Mathematics 10. This pilot course, taught at the grade 10 level, replaces both Mathematics at Work 10 and Mathematics Essentials 10. Students in this course examine big ideas in math with an emphasis on student centered problem solving and critical thinking skills. Specifically, students will cover topics such as measurement, data science, trigonometry, and financial literacy. The course is designed to have a focus on hands-on inquiry-based learning and topics relevant to students' lives.

## Math questions:

- Yes you can go to University with Math Inquiry 10. You can go for Bachelor of Arts type programming- ex:
   English, History, Social Work, Criminology, etc. Some Universities require Academic Math for B.A.
   Psychology. CHECK UNIVERSITY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
- Some NSCC programs require higher levels of Math and Science- especially the more technical programs.
   CHECK THE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS ON THE WEBSITE

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### Math questions cont...

- Once you are in Inquiry Math/Math at Work/Math
   Essentials you cannot change to the Academic Stream
   BUT you can always upgrade your Math after you leave
   High School through Continuing Ed programs.
- Most University Science and Engineering Degrees require Precal 12. Calculus 12 is not required anywhere, but is a helpful elective for University Prep!
- Nursing and Commerce require Academic Math.
- Requirements and agreements are changing check the admission requirements!

#### **Music Courses at MHS**

We offer a number of music courses at Millwood

**BAND** (Music 10B, 11B, 12B) for those who have been in band since Junior High or you play a brass, woodwind, percussion, strings (NOT guitar) and can read music with a level of confidence.

BAND is <u>not</u> outside of the schedule (am or after school)

**PERFORMING ARTS (Music 10P, 11P, 12P)** for those who play guitar, bass, drums, keys or sing with a few years experience and you want to get school credit for learning about rock and pop music! There is a performing aspect to this credit.

**BEGINNER GUITAR (Music 11S)** for those who have no experience or minimal experience playing guitar. We supply the guitar!

#### **Elective Courses for grade 10s at MHS**

We don't allow our grade 10s to take Bio 11 or their Canadian History class in their grade 10 year. Yes- other schools do allow this.

Our Science Department and Social Studies Department have looked at the mark data over the years and feel that students generally do better in these courses if they have completed their grade 10 English, grade 10 Math, and grade 10 Science BEFORE they attempt these courses. There is typically LOTS of time/room in schedules to complete these courses in grade 11. We will do everything we can to balance schedules.

**There are MANY different electives students can take in their grade 10 year**: Business 10, Business Tech 11, Comm Tech 11, Construction 10, Production Tech 11, Child Studies 11, Learning Strategies 11, Design 11, Geography 10, History 10, and many more- please consult the course selection booklet.

# Why are some courses coded as a grade 10 and some as a grade 11?

Students can only count 7 grade 10 courses toward graduation- so we have ensured some of our courses are coded as "grade 11 level"- but they are taken by grade 10s.

Only the grade 11 courses that are open for grade 10s to take are listed on the course selection portal on Powerschool (ie: your student will not be able to select anything they aren't allowed to take).

Many grade 11 courses are open to both grade 10 and 11 students to take. Many grade 12 courses are open to both grade 11 and 12 students to take.

#### **COOPERATIVE EDUCATION 12**

Students earn an Academic High School credit by completing a 25 Hour Classroom Component and an 80 Hour work placement.

Students can complete up to 3 COOP Credits.

Placements have included physiotherapy clinics, trades, armed forces, banks, retail management, classrooms, service industry, etc.

ONLY FOR GRADE 11 and 12 Students- must be 16 years old to apply. For more information, see your School Counsellor.



# Special Programs (application required)

O2 is a three year program that starts in grade 10 and that will help you as you work towards a career or occupation by linking what is being learned in school to the community and workplace. Students go on to University, NSCC, military, workplace, etc.

#### O2 Coordinator is Mr. Shaw

He will be visiting classes in the near future to speak to students about the program.

He will hand out applications and those who submit an application will be contacted for an interview.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- •Students SHOULD apply to NSCC in their grade 11 year.
- All programs at NSCC are offered on a first apply- first accepted basis.
- Students who delay applying may be waitlisted.
- Come see your School Counsellor for help applying.
- Students applying to University may do so in their grade 12 year.
